## Grade Point Average (GPA)

Grade points are calculated by multiplying the regular term hour value of the course by the point value of the grade earned. An "A" in a three-hour course earns 12 grade points, $a$ " $B$ " earns 9 points, $a$ " $C$ " earns 6 points, $a$ " $D$ " earns 3 points, an " $F$ " earns 0 points. The grade point average (GPA) is calculated by dividing the total points earned by the semester hours completed with grades of " $A$ "," " $\mathrm{B}^{\prime}$, " $C$ ", " $D$ ", or "F". For repeated courses, the most recent grade is used in the cumulative GPA; however, all grades earned in a course will be entered on your transcript and will remain there permanently. The following grades are not used to calculate your GPA: I (Incomplete) P/F (Pass/Fail Courses) W (Withdrawn). A college level GPA is also displayed on the student record which reflects only college level coursework and excludes developmental or preparatory coursework.
