

AGRI 2106: Sociology for Agriculture

This course will introduce students to the key concepts of the sociology of agriculture, while focussing on the importance of rural sociology within the sphere of agricultural extension. To facilitate an understanding of this linkage, students will explore the characteristics of West Indian and rural societies and be taught to understand the differences between various societies and groups/associations. The course will also expose students to topics such as educational psychology, motivation, teaching and learning.
